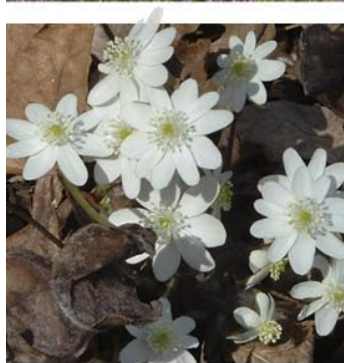

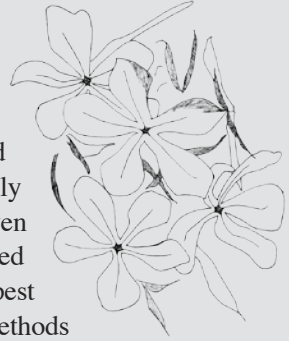

Welcome to Morning Sky Greenery

About our products . . .

At Morning Sky Greenery, we take care to produce high quality native plants that adapt easily to harsh environmental conditions. Our plants are not heavily forced for quick sales and mass market. Rather, they are carefully grown; hand watered & fertilized, acclimated and even overwintered to ensure their healthy growth when placed in a natural setting. We grow our plants using integrated pest management (IPM), which means that we use a variety of methods at our production facility to control insects and diseases. We do not rely on highly toxic chemical pesticides and herbicides to grow our plants.



We grow our plants in a variety of containers. The advantage of these container-grown plants is that they may be transplanted in the spring, summer, and fall. They may be kept in their own containers until you have the time to plant them.

Most of our plants are available as bedding plants in 6-packs and 12-packs, or in 3.5-inch, 5.75-inch, and 1-quart pots. Pot sizes vary slightly. Many of our plants are available in larger 1, 2, & 5 gallon pots. To find the sizes of individual plants, please look in the product columns of the plant list inside this catalog or on our website. If we do not carry a particular size you are interested in, we will custom grow large orders in the size pot you prefer.

Our plants are shipped to you through UPS. However, please inquire about special delivery of lakescapes and other large projects.

We pride ourselves on individual customer service. Our dedicated, informed staff is happy to work with you to find the right plants for your individual needs. We encourage you to call or e-mail us with your questions.

Morning Sky Greenery's Prairie Seed Mixes

We have a variety of standard seed mixes available. We can also create custom mixes. We recommend 8 lbs. of seed per acre, or 3.5 oz. per 1,000 square feet. It is essential that flower seeds are sown with grasses (at least 30% grasses). We also sell seeds by the scoop at our nursery. See our website for a list of plant species in these mixes.

Short, Dry Prairie Mix

Flower Mix contains 15-20 species

Moist Prairie Mix

Grass mix contains 3-4 species
Flowers mix contains 15-20 species

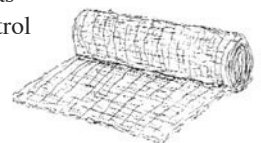

Our packages are made up of a diverse selection of native plants – not just the common ones! We use our discretion to choose the best plants which we feel are healthy, quality plants that will bring you great joy in your landscape Spring through Fall!

Prairie and Lakeshore Packages

Our Prairie and Lakeshore Packages are designed for your soil type and sunlight conditions. For a “naturalized” prairie or lakeshore planting these packages include wildflower and grass seedling and yearling plugs at a ratio of 1:1 and cover a 500 or a 1000 square foot area. Plugs are to be spaced one plant per square foot.

Prairie Mix 500

This plant mix covers approximately 500 square feet. It includes about 500 seedling and yearling plugs (6-packs and 12-packs) with a ratio of about 1:1 wildflowers to grasses. *We choose, you save!*

Prairie Mix 1000

This plant mix covers approximately 1000 square feet. It includes about 1000 seedling and yearling plugs (6-packs and 12-packs) with a ratio of about 1:1 wildflowers to grasses. *We choose, you save!*

These packages are designed for typical garden soil or your specified soil type. They include a mix of wildflower and grass seedlings and yearlings, garden design plans and planting instructions.

The Butterfly or Birdwatcher's Garden

Includes 72 plants (8 - 6 packs of flowers and 2 - 12 packs of grasses) with 8 species of wildflowers and 2 species of grasses known to attract butterflies or birds depending on your preference. A garden plan for an approx. 100 sq. ft. area of various shapes is provided. For full to partial sun.

Lakescaping

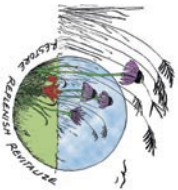

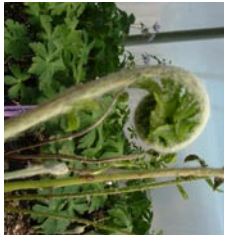
