# Welcome to Morning Sky Greenery

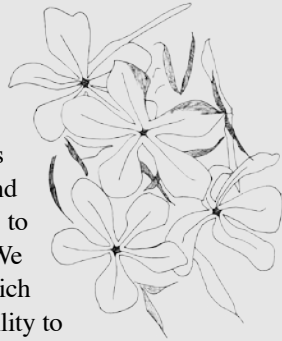
## About our products . . .

At Morning Sky Greenery, we take care to produce high quality native plants that adapt easily to harsh environmental conditions. Our plants are not heavily forced for quick sales and mass market. Rather, they are carefully grown: hand watered & fertilized, acclimated and even overwintered to ensure their healthy growth when placed in a natural setting. We grow our plants using integrated pest management (IPM), which means that we use a variety of methods at our production facility to control insects and diseases. We do not rely on highly toxic chemical pesticides and herbicides to grow them.

Our plants are grown in a variety of containers. The advantage of these container-grown plants is that they may be transplanted in the spring, summer, and fall. They may be kept in their own containers until you have the time to plant them. These plants are available as bedding plants in 6-packs and 12-packs, or in 3.5-inch, 5.75-inch, and 1-quart pots. To find the sizes of individual plants, please look in the product columns of the plant list inside this catalog or on our website. If we do not carry a particular size you are interested in, we will custom grow large orders in the size pot you prefer. In our continuing efforts toward environmental stewardship, we wash and reuse pots from a variety of sources, so pot sizes may, in some cases, vary slightly.

Our plants are typically shipped to you through UPS or other major carrier. However, please inquire about special delivery of lakescapes and other large projects.

We pride ourselves on individual customer service. Our dedicated, informed staff is happy to work with you to find the right plants for your individual needs. We encourage you to call or e-mail us with your questions.

# Prairie Seed Mixes

We have a variety of standard seed mixes available. We recommend a total of 8 lbs. of seed per acre, or 3.5 oz. per 1,000 square feet. It is essential that flower seed is sown with grass seed (at least 30% grasses). Our Standard seed mixes are also available by the scoop at our nursery. If you are interested in custom seed mixes please contact us for more information.

*\* Flowers and grasses listed in each mix may vary slightly depending on availability.*

## Short, Dry Prairie Mix

Formulated for a sandy or dry, gravelly soil type and full to part sun. Intended for planting in a large area. Flowers and grasses are under 3' tall.

**Flowers:** *Amorpha canescens, Ceanthous americanus, Chameacrista fasciculata, Coreopsis palmata, Echinacea angustifolia, Lespedeza capitata, Liatris aspera, Penstemon grandiflorus, Petalostemon candidum, Petalostemon purpureum, Potentilla arguta, Pulsatilla nuttalliana, Ratibita columnifera, Rosa arkansana, Rudbeckia hirta, Verbena stricta, Zizia aptera.* **Grasses:** *Bouteloua curtipendula, Bouteloua Gracilis, Schizachyrium scoparium.*

## Mesic Prairie Mix

Formulated for a medium soil type and full to part sun. Intended for planting in a large area. Flowers and grasses are 3-5' tall with some even taller species.

**Flowers:** *Aster laevis, Aster novae-angliae, Astragalus canadensis, Coreopsis palmata, Desmodium canadense, Galium boreale, Liatris aspera, Liatris ligulistylis, Monarda fistulosa, Petalostemon candidum, Petalostemon purpureum, Ratibita columnifera, Ratibita pinnata, Rudbeckia hirta, Solidago rigida, Verbena stricta, Zizia aptera, Zizia aurea.* **Grasses:** *Andropogon gerardi, Bouteloua curtipendulam, Elymus canadensis, Panicum virgatum, Schizachyrium scoparium, Sorghastrum nutans.*

## Moist Prairie Mix

Formulated for a moist soil type that may dry out in summer and full to part sun. Intended for planting in a large area. Flowers and grasses reach a height 3 - 5' or more.

**Flowers:** *Aster novae-angliae, Caltha palustris, Desmodium canadense, Eupatorium maculatum, Eupatorium perfoliatum, Galium boreale, Helenium autumnale, Heliposis helianthoides, Iris versicolor, Liatris ligulistylis, Liatris pycnostachya, Ratibita pinnata, Rudbeckia hirta, Silphium perfoliatum, Thalictrum dasycarpum, Verbena hastata, Veronia fasciculata, Zizia aurea.* **Grasses:** *Andropogon gerardi, Elymus canadensis, Panicum virgatum, Sorghastrum nutans.*

## Deluxe Prairie Mix

Formulated for dry to medium soil type and full to part sun. Intended for planting in a large area. A diverse mix of some of our showiest wildflowers and grasses. Flowers and grasses are generally less than 3' in height.

**Flowers:** *Allium stellatum, Amorpha canescens, Aster laevis, Ceanthous americanus, Chameacrista fasciculata, Coreopsis palmata, Echinacea angustifolia, Galium boreale, Lespedeza capitata, Liatris aspera, Liatris ligulistylis, Monarda fistulosa, Penstemon grandiflorus, Petalostemon candidum, Petalostemon purpureum, Phlox pilosa, Pycnanthemum virginicum, Ratibita columnifera, Rosa arkansana, Rudbeckia hirta, Solidago speciosa, Verbena stricta, Zizia aptera, Zizia aurea.* **Grasses:** *Bouteloua curtipendula, Bouteloua gracilis Bromus kalmii, Schizachyrium scoparium and Stipa viridula.*

## Wildflower Lakeshore or Prairie Packages

*An economical choice for a “natural” prairie or lakeshore planting designed for your soil type and sun exposure. These packages include wildflower and grass seedling and yearling plugs of a ratio of about 1:1 These packages cover approximately a 500 or a 1000 square foot area. We choose the highest quality plants and you save!*

### **Lakeshore or Prairie Mix 500**

This plant mix covers approximately 500 square feet. It will contain plants for one soil type and sun exposure. It includes 252 wildflower (7-15 species) and 240 (3-5 species) grass seedling and yearling plugs for a total of 492 plants! (Wildflowers come in 6 packs, and grasses come in 12 packs). *We choose, you save \$50.00!*

### **Lakeshore or Prairie Mix 1000**

This plant mix covers approximately 1000 square feet. It includes plants for one soil type and sun exposure. It includes 504 wildflower (15 or more species) and 480 grass ( 5 or more species) seedling and yearling plugs for a total of 984 plants! (Wildflowers come in 6-packs and grasses come in 12-packs). *We choose, you save over \$135.00!*

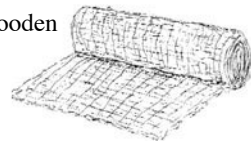

## Prairie Restoration Projects

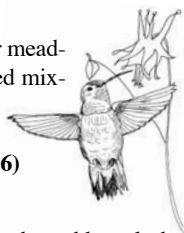

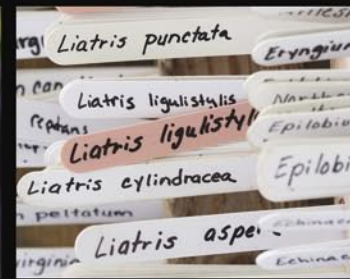
